## TxDOT 380 Bypass Project Meeting 3-9-2022

The Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) has announced that it will be conducting an in-person meeting as well as an online virtual public meeting to address a project that focuses on a stretch of US 380 that is close to the Stonebridge Ranch area.

## About the Project

The Texas Department of Transportation is proposing to construct a project which includes US 380 in Collin County from Coit Road west of McKinney in the Prosper/Frisco area to FM 1827 east of McKinney. The stretch of US 380 that will be affected is approximately 15 miles long. The project plans include a couple of bypass options, one of which is very favorable to Stonebridge (Option B), which we will be supporting.

The meeting is set to take place on Tuesday, March 22, 2022, from 5:30-7:30 pm at the Collin College Central Park Campus Conference Center in McKinney. It will be conducted in an open house format, where the public may come and go at their convenience. During the meeting, TxDOT staff will be available to answer questions regarding the proposed project. The virtual meeting, which is NOT a live event, will be available for viewing beginning Tuesday, March 22 at 5:30 pm. Those who could not attend the event will have until the end of the comment deadline to view it online. The deadline date is Wednesday, April 6 at 11:59 pm.
