Solution to down fall of leaves causing flooding of creek is still tabled until next Fall.

New Business:

Jim Buerkle – Board Update

- There will be a long-range plan to update and repair Beach Club and Community Center.
- Update on new Landscape Manger hiring.
- There is concern that parts of the community are looking dated.
- Fines and collections are a concern.
- Water costs in SBR are rising due to leaks in the irrigation systems. Irrigation personnel
 are supposed to test systems and identify where leaks are coming from. We are to let
 Eric know if systems are being tested and no one is watching the heads.

Linda mentioned seeing lawn services and residents blowing debris from lawns in the streets that end up in storm drains. This should be reported to Eric.

Jane reported on L&G Budget forecast items. Drainage and corrosion problems identified in Quail Creek that needs to be addressed. Area A – Superscapes is a priority 1. Melton Ridge has a serious erosion problem.
